My dear Mr. King:

On examining the file of James Goings, deceased (stepson of your cook), I find that while he duly applied for insurance in the sum of \$5,000 when in the military service, premiums on which were deducted from his pay to and including the month of May, 1919, no payments of any premiums whatever were made after his discharge from the service June 28, 1919. The insurance therefore lapsed for non-payment of premiums after discharge and was not in effect at the time of the man's death during the recent "race riots" at Tulsa.

I am sorry that under the circumstances there are no benefits under the War Risk Insurance Act payable in this case.
